Opening Worship. Peter welcomed members then read from 1 Peter 2: 4-12 and then led the meeting in prayer.

Minutes. Those of the Church Meeting held on Monday 4 February 2013 were signed as a correct record.

Finance and Administration

<u>Treasurer's Report.</u> **Mrs J Slater** went through the monthly finance sheet. She said that we now had more members doing Direct Debit transfers so that helped. Peter had put in a request for another £3,000 this year for help in the outreach ministry of the church. The North East Area Executive had agreed. It just has to be ratified by the Area Assembly on 6 April (at Whitley Bay). We have recently bought a bigger freezer and a small tabletop cooker. Peter thanked the Treasurer and reminded Members that if they have any questions on finance matters to speak to the Treasurer.

<u>Secretary's Correspondence</u>. **Miss C Chisholm** had received information from Mrs J Scott regarding the price for using Church House. This year this has gone up to £46 for a morning booking and £68 for a full day. (We have it booked for the morning of 3rd August). (This correspondence has now been passed to the Treasurer).

Property. (a) Windows. The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority has now informed us that we can change the majority of these and use slim-line double-glazing. 2 of the windows have 'heritage value'. We have 3 photographs that show what the windows looked like originally. We have to submit another Listed Building Application with drawings of all the new windows. Then we will go out for quotes. Also see about getting grants from various places. We still have a long way to go. (b) <u>Decoration of the Upper Room</u>. The painting and varnishing is complete. The windows will now have blinds. Mr K Brand said that he had spent £200 on paint. Last month he had been given a quote for a 2-week hire Oof a Tower Scaffold but Mrs P Jackson had a word with Mr James Harker and he lent one to us for the work. (c) Flooring. The original carpet was a health and safety hazard. After discussion Mrs P Jackson said she would make enquiries regarding carpeting etc. (d) General Tidy Up. It was agreed that the upstairs needed this so we would arrange for a Skip then have a meeting to decide what we were keeping and what to throw out. Peter thanked Mr K Brand and his team (Mrs P Brand; Mr J Currie; Mr J Gill; Mr R Slater; and Mr A Wyatt) for all the work they had done upstairs and the on-going work regarding the windows.

<u>Sound Equipment</u>. At the meeting on Monday 4th February, **Mr K Brand** reported the need for a new system. Peter had received a quote for a larger scheme and said that he would look at the sound equipment element of the scheme was. This quote was dated 15th October 2011. Peter had looked again at the quote and worked out that our needs would mean spending £1,824.60. **Peter** will contact the firm and ask for an up-to-date price for this element and bring it to the meeting on **Monday 8 April 2013**.

Mission and Society.

<u>Christian Aid – Lent Lunches</u>. Our event was due to take place on <u>Wednesday 13 March 2013</u>. **Mrs P Jackson** will make some more soup and, following our event anything that is left over will be passed on to the 'All Churches" event the following week. <u>Women's World Day of Prayer Service</u>. **Mrs P Jackson** reported that this had been a really nice Service. Next year the Catholics at St Margaret Clitherow Church, Threshfield, will host it.

<u>Church Coffee Morning</u>. This is due to be held in Church House on Saturday 3rd August. **Mrs J Slater** said that she would not be here on that date but would start collecting for the Tombola in July. We shall need someone to take charge of the event.

<u>Newsletter</u>. There was a general discussion regarding this publication. **Peter** had mentioned recently that he was thinking of changing the look and content of the Newsletter. Members wanted to know if there was a restriction on the number of pages as sometimes articles submitted were not included. The time it was distributed each month. Members will consider their thoughts and further discussion will take place at a **future meeting**.

<u>WAGs</u>. **Mrs J Slater** spoke about this Group which was growing all the time. It was not a Christian Group but was started here by Christians. She thanked the church for its support. Finance and Administration

<u>Treasurer's Report.</u> **Mrs J Slater** went through the monthly Finance Sheet. She said she was very pleased with how things were going and said that more members were now taking up monthly Standing Orders for their weekly contributions. Peter thanked the Treasurer for her work with the Church Finances and reminded members that, if they wanted to ask questions about finances, to give the Treasurer a call.

<u>Secretary's Correspondence</u>. (a) <u>President Elect</u>. There had only been one nomination for this position – Revd Barbara Bridges from Moreton-in-Marsh and Draycott. Members confirmed their support. Peter said that finding someone to fill this position was becoming more difficult every year. It was a job that required a great deal of commitment. (The Secretary will contact Nottingham). (b) <u>May Assembly</u>. This year it was taking place in Tonbridge Wells over the weekend 10th 11th and 12th of May. This includes the now yearly President's House Party. (The Secretary has the Papers).

<u>Property</u>. (a) <u>Windows</u>. In the absence of Mr K Brand **Peter** reported that we now have to fill in a detailed Listed Building Consent Application for the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority. (b) <u>Flooring</u>. Mrs P Jackson had requested a price for the carpeting of the Upper Room and the Porch and we were still waiting for this. (c) <u>General Tidy Up</u>. Following the decoration of the Upper Room it was suggested at the March Church Meeting that this was needed upstairs – due to weather conditions and Easter the suggested get-together has not happened yet.

<u>Sound Equipment</u>. <u>Food Bank</u>. **Mrs A Gill** asked if members were aware of any hardships in the area and whether there was need of one of these in Grassington. Mrs P Jackson said that the Methodist Church were collecting food etc and passing it onto the Salvation Army and Mrs J Calvert said she thought St Michael's were doing something as well. Mrs A Gill will contact the Methodist Church.

<u>Annual Flower Festival (Churches Together)</u>. This year the hosts are St Michael's at Linton and the dates are Friday 19th – Monday 22nd July. The theme is "Stories from the Bible". There is a meeting of those interested on Friday 26th April at 10.30am at St Michael's. **Mrs A Graham** and **Mrs P Jackson** said they would go.

<u>Visit from New Hope Christian Fellowship</u>. The Secretary had received an Email from Mr Oliver Evans. The Church is having an 'Away Day' and would like to use our rooms for the day. (coffee lounge and kitchen and possibly the church for a short service before they go home. This Fellowship was originally Buttershaw Congregational Church. Minutes Of Church Meeting Held on Monday 13th May 2013

Preliminaries

Opening Worship. Peter welcomed those members present, read from Isaiah 62 then lead the meeting in prayer.

Minutes. Those of the Church Meeting held on Monday 8th April 2013 were signed as a correct record.

Finance and Administration

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>. The Treasurer was on holiday so there was no Report. Peter said that the church had now received the 2nd installment of last year's £3,000.

<u>Secretary's Correspondence</u>. The Secretary said that she had received an Email from the family of Mrs Sheila Weaver following the internment of her ashes last month. They sent a picture and details of the stone they wanted to put near the internment spot (in Winn's Corner). Mrs W Cummins was her mother. Members Agreed to this.

Property.

(a) <u>Car Park</u>. At the Meeting held on 8th April **Peter** said he would go and see staff at Gills Top about the problems on the car park. This meeting took place on 15th April and the following is the report that Peter read out to members.

"The good news is that we own the land adjacent to the church, the bad news is that we have given away the right to park on it. On 21st July 1988 an agreement was established between the church and Anchor Housing which meant that for the annual payment of a pepper-corn we would give them access and parking to the land on a shared basis. In return they would accept responsibility for 80% of any costs relating to the upkeep and maintenance of the land, walls, tarmac etc.

Regrettably, in the same agreement we also gave them 80% of the parking spaces on the terms of a 125 year lease. There are five marked spaces, which consist of two spaces next to the church and three spaces facing the graveyard which are also marked. In addition there are three spaces which could be occupied behind the three facing the graveyard bringing the total number of spaces to eight. We, the church are legally entitled to two of these spaces, the assumption being that these are the ones next to the church.

There are two possible ways out of the situation.

- 1. If Anchor Housing should cease to exist the terms of the lease would be void.
- 2. Attempt to sell the land and prevent anyone from parking on it."

Following Peter's report members talked round the problem but decided that we should just leave things as they are. If there was anything on at church we should let Gills Top know. The Manager had said that members of staff would be given permits for their cars to show that they worked at Gills Top. We have these to show we are church attenders.

- (b) <u>Windows</u>. **Mr K Brand** said that he had now received the paperwork to enable us to apply for Listed Building Consent for these. Then we would have to send out to contractors. **Peter** said he thought that one of the windows overlooking the churchyard would be good as a Memorial Window. Members liked the idea.
- (c) <u>Flooring</u>. **Mrs P Jackson** had some samples of carpeting for the Upper Room and was waiting for the quote from Tapsall and West, Skipton.

Sound Equipment. We are still waiting for quotes.

Grass Cutting. **Mr K Brand** said that he was looking for people who were prepared to take on this task. If you can please have a word with him.

Mission and Society

<u>Christian Aid Week</u>. **Mrs P Jackson** asked Members for help covering our area for the House to House Collection.

<u>Food Bank</u>. This was mentioned at the Church Meeting on Monday 8th April. **Mrs A Gill** had contacted Skipton Baptist Church. The food is collected from the church in hampers by community-based agencies who then take them directly to their clients. Amongst these are Craven District Council, Foundation Housing, Yorkshire Housing, Homestart, the York and North Yorkshire Probation Trust and the Citizens Advice Bureau. This makes sure that the food goes to those in real need and will cover those known to the agencies in our own area. Members agreed to support the Skipton Food Bank. Mrs A Gill and Mrs C Parry wil take the food to Skipton. If you would like to volunteer, please have a word with Mrs Gill or Mrs Parry. Mrs A Gill would be happy to go and collect the basket but is away until the end of May.

<u>Flower Festival</u>. This is due to take place at St Michael's, Linton in July. The Theme is "Stories from the Bible". **Mrs A Graham** attended a recent meeting and our story is 'Moses and the Burning Bush". In her absence, Mrs P Jackson said that **Mrs Graham** was looking for a suitable doll to use as Moses and also some 'sheep'. Also is there anyone who could help her with this display? The display will be set up on 18^{th} July and will be open from 19^{th} – 22^{nd} July.

<u>Visit from New Hope Christian Fellowship</u>. Finance and Administration
